



Our annual school house program was very successful thanks to Ida Connors, Marilyn Ettinger, Sunshine from Christmas Goose and Jackie Reilly. Remember our new monthly block program; "Puzzle Block" will be

rolling out in November. A sample will be shown in October for those who missed the September meeting and would like more information.

A huge thank you and hug to the membership for participating in our monthly 50/50 money program. This is where you can purchase a ticket and take a chance on splitting the money collected at the meeting with the guild. We've raised an estimated \$200 in seven months.

Our black and white fabric strip club is going into its final month. In October, the last black and white strip and instructions will be distributed. Remember; "create a quilt top with the blocks by the November meeting to have your name put in a drawing for 3 yards of fabric for your backing." So, start thinking and planning on how you want those blocks in a quilt top.

Your comments and suggestions for programs and activities were much appreciated. Thirty-five members from the September guild meeting completed the <u>Programs/Activities</u> Questionnaire. The results are as follow:

- 1. Would you like the Secret Quilter program to continue? 83% would like the program to continue. (See JoAnne's Piece in the newsletter about "Secret Quilter").
- 2. Would you like to see more classes and lectures from Professional quilters? 97% stated yes on this. However, this can only happen when we reach out \$3,000 goal of selling Opportunity Tickets by April.
- 3. Do you want the President's Challenges to continue? 77% want them to continue. Many suggested having only two challenges verses four. (see the last challenge "This Ole House" in the newsletter that is due in January)
- 4. Would you like to have another road trip to the International Quilt show in July or any other quilt show? 95% would like to have this offered again in July.
- 5. Would you like the guild to plan more than one retreat a year? 92% said "no."

Additional comments included "Maybe an in town retreat;" "Maybe have a local retreat where we can go home in the evenings;" "Have programs on how to use fabrics other than cottons—how to make blocks come out the right size—tips and techniques;" "have members sell old quilt magazines & resell them at 25¢ to raise money for the guild;" "more local teachers and speakers." "More sew-ins and inexpensive guild classes."

Would you be interested in volunteering to run a program next year? Sadly, one person in 30 said yes.

#### SHOW & TELL—OUR OWN MINI QUILT SHOW

Show and Tell might be the most popular part of our Guild meeting! Members show their finished quilts and have a few minutes to tell the Guild about their work. WE WANT TO SEE ALL YOUR QUILTS!! Large and small, completed and quick—taken together they create our own little quilt show at every meeting. Please bring a quilt or two to show in October—inspire us to create for the fall.

## "Now You're Cooking"

Las Vegas Quilters\*\* 2012 President Challenge #3

There will be two categories (1) half apron and (2) full apron with one winner from each. Members are only allowed to submit one apron for the challenge.

The rules were simple. Make an apron from either category that provides coverage for the garments underneath, with primary coverage being in the front. The apron can be worn for cooking or barbecuing. It must have at least one piece of fabric that is "cooking" related. This means the fabric has to have some type of food, apron, pot, pan, appliances or utensils in it. Size of the fabric is the "cook's" choice. The apron

can be made from a commercial, magazine or internet pattern or your own design. No ready-made aprons allowed nor pre-printed panels can be used in the design of the apron. The creator of the apron must wear their apron at the guild meeting. (We'll have an apron fashion show.)

The apron can be as basic or elaborate as the sewer desires. Some suggestions are vintage, retro, contemporary, smocked or whatever the "cook" whips up. Aprons can have any type of "garnish" that the "cook" would like to add such as appliqué, ruffles, embroidery, or buttons. Remember, the apron has to be functional.

**Deadline:** All entries are to be worn at the **October 10**<sup>th</sup> guild meeting. Judging will be done by the membership and guests. The two winners will receive a gift card to a surprise location.

#### "This Ole House"

Las Vegas Quilters \*\* 2012 President Challenge #4

Have you ever thought about the many kinds of houses there are? Well, let's name a few; school house, cabin, out house, grass hut, tee-pee, castle, tree house, bird house, cottage, igloo, shack, lighthouse, etc. Your challenge is to create a quilted wall hanging of at least one type of house or home that has each of the rainbow colors somewhere in it that is listed below. You must able to see the color from two feet away. The colors can be in the actual fabric, threads, or different embellishments.

Red: represents joy, passion, sensitivity and love
Orange: is associated with enthusiasm, happiness and creativity
Yellow: is associated with joy, happiness and energy
Green: symbolizes growth, harmony, freshness and fertility
Blue: it is often associated with loyalty, trust, faith and truth
Purple: is associated with wisdom, creativity, mystery and magic
White is associated with goodness, innocence, and purity

Techniques that can be used are foundation piecing, paper piecing, traditional block piecing, appliqueing and/or embroidery. Embellishments are limited to lace, rick-rack, buttons, yo-yos, ribbon and threads. You must also be the quilter. In other words, the entrant is the sole creator of their "House" wall hanging from beginning to end.

Size: No smaller than 18" square and no larger than 144" perimeter.

Deadline: All entries are to be brought to the January guild meeting. Judging will be done by your peers and guests.


If you have any problem with making this block, there will be a couple at the next meeting for you to inspect.


