Tip of the month: I saw this on a sewing show and I tried it and love it! This is a different take on the Best Press Recipe. With the old recipe, we used about 1/3 cup vodka and 2/3 cup water, which worked great. With this recipe, use 1/3 cup vodka, 1/3 liquid starch, and fill the rest of your bottle with water. It makes such a crisp seam and fold. If you use too much starch it will dirty your iron but it washes off with a wet rag so play with it until you get the right mix.
