8. Quarterly drawings will be held in March, June and September at the monthly Guild Meetings for those who have completed UFO's in that quarter.

We hope to have a lovely meal, a cash bar, games, prizes, and Secret Angel gift exchanges between those of you who wish to participate.



Bios for Nominees for Executive Board Elections 2023

I am a former Public Library Director and worked with a large budget with many employees. I take pride in my ability to bring people together to work towards a common goal. I'm proud of our guild's outreach to different charities and hope that we can continue to help those that are less fortunate than us. Perhaps we can have a representative from a charity to come and speak to us about how a donation was used or appreciated. I believe that no one can succeed in a vacuum and it takes a dedicated Board and guild members to bring the organization forward. I know I cannot fail with everyone's help.

Sharon Melpolder: Nominated for VICE-PRESIDENT

I am a "new" resident of North Las Vegas. I arrived during COVID in July, 2020 and am just starting to feel a part of the neighborhood. I would consider it a privilege to take an active role in the Guild next year and serve as your Vice President. Here is some information about me and the things that I have been quilting most recently, if we didn't get a chance to meet at a quilt meeting.

I worked as a chemical Engineer at Eastman Kodak in Rochester, NY for 20+ years and after retirement moved to Prescott, AZ in 1999.

The builder of my new home's wife was a quilter and when purchasing our home, I saw a quilt she was working on spread on the living room floor and became an instant "wanna-be" quilter. Connie's quilt was a figurative quilt depicting the bride and groom's lives from childhood until the present. I was awed by it and decided that upon moving to Prescott, I would take up quilting, which I did. During my time there I was a member of 2 quilt guilds and enjoyed making quilts: bed quilts, lap quilts, and wall hangings. I enjoy making a quilt for someone that I love which I hope will become part of their family's heritage.

I have one quilt that I have been planning for many years, but still have not finalized the design. It will include my parents, siblings, and the 2 subsequent generations. I think that the materials I wish to use exist in my stash, but as of yet I have not begun to cut.

My remaining UFO is a Frank Lloyd Wright design that I was making into valences for my bedroom, but we moved. Now they may become pillow shams or valences for my new bedroom that has 3 windows instead of 2, depending on how much material I have. My bedroom's quilt is a Rib-bon Weave Stack-n-Whack pattern by Bethany Reynolds that I saw in Vicky's Fabric Shop in Kapa'a, Kauai. My fond memory is making the quilt on Kauai, where I spent delightful days working on the quilt with Maile Bloxsom, a lovely and talented quilter who became a friend.

Another Hawaiian memory is making a Sashiko wall hanging designed by Sylvia Phippen that I saw displayed at a quilt shop on Maui. I adapted it by substituting brightly colored dragonflies with an 8 inch wing-span that are found on the island for the butterflies that were part of the original design.

As I become a part of this guild, I am looking forward to learning new techniques from and making new friends of my quilting-sisters.
