Each person should bring up to 80, 2.5" strips of baby/kid themed fabric as their stake. These can be a precut Jelly Roll strips or strips you have cut from widths of fabric. The strips may be any color or pattern, solid or prints that is baby/kid friendly. *Please take care with cutting and use ONLY quality cotton quilting fabric you would be happy to receive.*

Over the next few months, we'll create some fun jelly roll baby quilts to donate. Baby quilts should be about 36" - 42" x 36" to 48". That way you can back them with one width of fabric. You can make any pattern you like. Baby quilts ready to donate should be brought in to our Sept, Oct. and Nov. meeting/events.



Starburst Quilt Class-(follow up)


For those of you who attended the Starburst Quilt Class on the 17th of June, we hope you all had a great time and are working hard to finish your quilt and share it at our July Meeting.



INSTRUCTIONS:

1. In a large microwave safe bowl, combine the marshmallows and butter. Microwave for 1-2 minutes until the butter is melted and the marshmallows start to puff up.

2. Stir the mixture thoroughly and then mix in the Rice Krispies cereal. Let cool in the bowl.

3. Microwave the candy melts in a bowl for 3-4 minutes at 50% power, stirring every 30 seconds until melted.

4. Dip the top of the cones in the melted chocolate and lightly shake to get rid of any excess.

5. Immediately sprinkle the nonpareils over the melted chocolate to coat. Place in the freezer to harden.

6. Using your hands, scoop out a portion of the Rice Krispie mix and make into the shape of an ice cream scoop. Press into the candy coated sugar cone.

 Top each Rice Krispie scoop with the larger sprinkles, being sure to press them firmly into the Rice Krispie "ice cream".
Repeat for each cone.
