Isle of Man Log Cabin Blocks

I recently read an article in the American Quilter magazine about the Isle of Man and the unusual way they traditionally pieced the Log Cabin Block. So, I researched more on this unique piecing-quilting method.

The Isle of Man is located is an island located in the Irish Sea between England and Ireland. It is a sovereign country with its own government

and laws. The Native people have a rich history with Viking and English influences. The name for this Quilting technique is called "Manx Quilting." The Island was traditionally very remote, and the people could not get or afford scissors or sewing machines. So, they devised a method of sewing Log Cabin quilts using what they had on "Hand." Fabric came from worn out clothing, or bedding.

The block construction is made with a foundation piece and a quilt as you go method. The quilt has no batting and traditionally were hand pieced, involving a folding and overlapping of the logs.

The quilter would use her hand span, from an out-stretched thumb to the little finger. to measure the size of the foundation blocks. My hand span is 8 inches or 20cm.

Other quilter's blocks would be a different size depending upon the span of their hand. But



each quilter's blocks would be the same size.

The strips would be torn or cut with a knife. The center square would be measured by the inside measurement

of the middle finger. My measurement is 3 ¾ inches or approximately 8cm.



The widths of the logs would be the measurement from the base of the thumb to the bottom of the thumbnail. My measurement is 2 inches or 5 cm.

The center square would be placed in the center of the foundation piece and then the foundation piece would be folded up to the edge of the center square and then folded



again. This would be repeated on all 4 sides.

The first log would be placed right sides together raw edges even with the top of the square. A hand sewn running stitch would be sewn about a quarter of an inch down from the edge. The needle and thread would be pulled to the back of the block, a quarter of an inch from the end. The first log would be folded back with the matching the raw edge of the log to the crease. Doing this creates a ¼ inch pleat at each seam.

They would rotate the block 90 degrees and add the next log even with the edge of the

square, stitch it down ¼ inch away from the edge and continue around the block in such a manner until there were 4 logs on each side of the center square.

As with the American log cabin block, they would do all light strips on two adjacent sides and dark strips on the other two adjacent sides. Sewing the block together by putting raw edges of the logs together sewing a ¼ inch away from the edge. The foundation would be folded and pinned back out of the way. Then the foundation piece would be folded over the raw edge and stitched down, like a French seam.





4 blocks would be put together with the traditional cross design and the next 4 blocks would be rotated so that the lights would form the cross in the center. Alternating the design, light -dark-light -dark across and down the quilt.

Interesting that these quilts were not as warm as our American quilts with batting, so they would make a rag rug to put on the bed and would use these quilts to wrap up in in the room with a fireplace. The blocks tend to be heavier than our Log Cabin blocks due to the folding technique.

Sewing of these quilts were done in the evenings after

the chores were done and usually in poor lighting. The folded back method would hide any uneven stitching or irregular edges to the logs. This is a great project for those of you that like doing hand work on vacation, riding in the car or just relaxing in front of the TV.

Hole-in-One Father's Day Cupcakes

- 2 cups Gold Medal[™] all-purpose flour
- 1 1/4 teaspoons baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 cup hot water
- 2/3 cup unsweetened baking cocoa
- 3/4 cup shortening
- 1 1/2 cups granulated sugar
- 2eggs
- 1teaspoon vanilla

Vanilla Buttercream Frosting

- 6 cups powdered sugar
- 2/3 cup butter or margarine, softened
- 1tablespoon vanilla

3 to 4 tablespoons milk

Decorations


- 3 graham cracker squares, crushed
- About 1/3 cup Betty Crocker™ Decorating
- Decors green candy sprinkles
- 24 colored straws
- Colored paper and tape
- 24 white gum balls or other round
- white candies



Heat oven to 350°F. Place paper baking cup in each of 24 regular-size muffin cups. In medium bowl, mix flour, baking soda, salt and baking powder; set aside. In small bowl, mix hot water and cocoa until dissolved; set aside. In large bowl, beat shortening with electric mixer on medium speed 30 seconds. Gradually add granulated sugar, about 1/4 cup at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat 2 minutes longer. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Beat in 1 teaspoon vanilla. On low speed, alternately add flour mixture, about a third at a time, and cocoa mixture, about half at a time, beating just until blended. Divide batter evenly among muffin cups, filling each about two-thirds full. Bake 20 to 25 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool 5 minutes; remove cupcakes from pans to cooling racks. Cool completely, about 30 minutes. In large bowl, mix powdered sugar and butter with spoon or electric mixer on low speed. Stir in 1 tablespoon vanilla and 3 tablespoons milk.

Gradually beat in just enough remaining milk to make frosting smooth and spreadable. Frost cooled cupcakes.

On one side of each cupcake, sprinkle about 1/2 teaspoon graham cracker crumbs for "sand." On other side of cupcake, sprinkle generous 1/2 teaspoon green sprinkles for "grass." Cut straws into 3 1/2-inch lengths. Cut colored paper into flags. Tape each flag to one end of each straw piece; poke into cupcake. Gently press one gum ball into each cupcake for golf
