And the Survey Says

Thank you for those who were able to complete an Interest Survey at our January meeting. Here are some results:

Of the 44 surveys returned 4 people consider themselves beginner quilters; 22 intermediate; 17 advanced and 1 expert. The most preferred method of quilting is piecing followed equally by machine embroidery and applique. Paper piecing was next in preference with a few enjoying hand embroidery, thread painting and coloring on fabric. Most of us prefer traditional quilting followed by modern and art quilts equally. Regarding the kind of programs, we enjoy most are guest speakers and trunk shows. It is not possible to be more specific in this reporting because many people did not rank their preferences but instead checked off those that interested them. Class interest preferences included paper piecing the most often listed followed by embroidery, crazy quilts and different techniques. Thank you for your input as it will be help in planning.

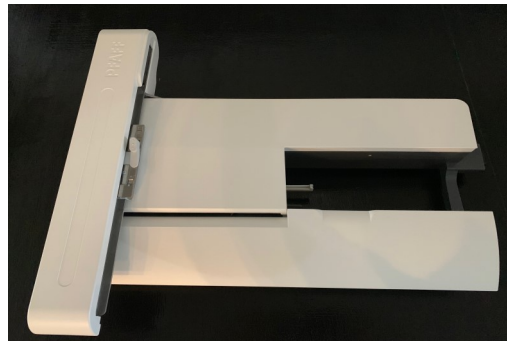

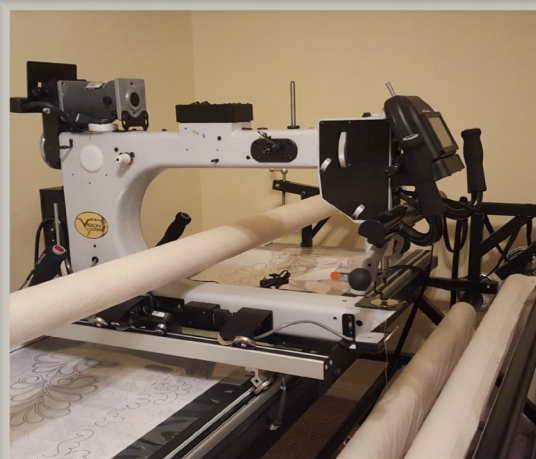

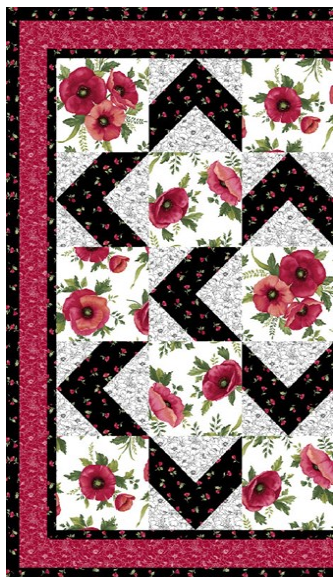

TIP OF THE MONTH: A recipe for the Fried Apples at Cracker Barrel.

Prep. Time: 25 Min **Serves:** 6

- ¼ cup Butter
- 6 tart apples, cored & sliced
- 1 tsp. lemon juice
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- dash of salt
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon

Directions: In a skillet, melt butter. Add apples, sprinkle lemon juice over, then add sugar and dash of salt. Cover and cook over low heat for 15 min. until apples are tender. Sprinkle with cinnamon and nutmeg. Do not over cook.

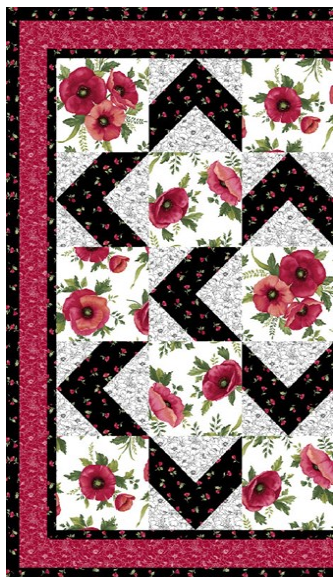

Tip of the Month: Good OL' Southern Biscuits

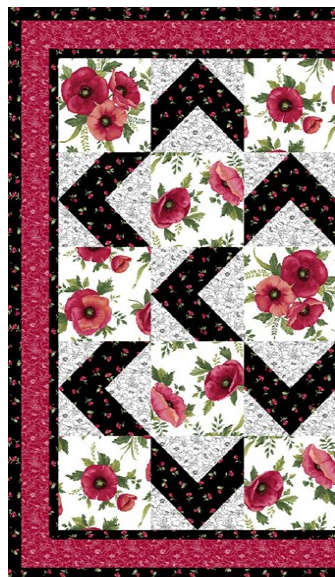
2 Cups self-rising flour
½ cup chilled butter cut into ¼ -inch slices
1 cup whole buttermilk
Melted butter for brushing tops of biscuits

Preheat oven to 450°F. Add flour to medium bowl, and using a pastry blender, cut in chilled butter until mixture is crumbly. Slowly add buttermilk stirring with fork until mixture is combined. Turn dough out onto floured surface, and gently knead 2 or 3 times, or just until dough is smooth. Pat dough to ¼ in thickness, fold dough in half so it measures ½ inch thickness. Cut out with biscuit cutter or drinking glass. Place on baking sheet, brush with melted butter. Bake for 12 to 15 minutes until golden brown. ENJOY!

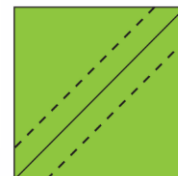

 - * Quilts for Child Haven, Fisher House, VA Hospital, NLV Police Child Crisis, etc.
 - * Quilts of Valor for NV Service men & women: Make or donate quilt tops, a finished block, or fabric (red, white, blue, cream, gold, or patriotic)
- Scraps for Pet Beds, for our local 'no kill' shelters

Quick tips on making Half Square Triangles

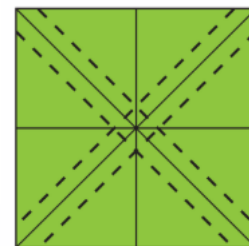
Take the finished size of the triangle and add $7/8$ " inch to the size and cut that size square out of two different fabrics. Usually one fabric is light and the other is dark. Put lighter fabric on top of the darker fabric right sides together. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the other with a straight edge.

Stitch $1/4$ " on both sides of the line. Cut the square on the diagonal lining up your ruler on the line. With the dark side up, press open the square. This presses the seam to the dark. This gives you two (HST)



Another method for doing HSTs is called "The Magic 8" it makes 8 HSTs is to take your desired finished size HST and add $7/8$ " then multiple by 2. this gives you the size square you need to make 8 HSTs.

Cut 2 squares the size figured as above. Place one on top of the other, right sides together. Draw two diagonal lines corner to corner. Stitch $1/4$ " on either side of the diagonal lines. Then take your ruler and cut vertically and horizontally down the center, perpendicular to the first line. Then cut between the $1/4$ " sewn lines on the marked line corner to corner. It is helpful if you have a rotating matt so your you don't move the pieces. Move the pieces apart and press the seam to the dark.



Using precuts you can make HSTs by taking a light precut and dark precut and sew $1/4$ " away from the edge all the way around the square. Then cut the square corner to corner and you have 4 HSTs.

There are also many tools out there to help make HSTs. There are paper rolls that if you want a specific size, i.e.; 2 or 3"inch finished squares. The company that makes this paper grid it's called **Triangles on a Roll**.

Fons and Porter makes a ruler that takes the math out of figuring out your triangles. Available on Amazon.com

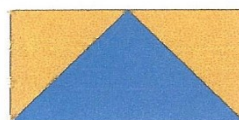

Quick Tips by Phyllis Suiter

NO WASTE METHOD FOR MAKING FLYING GEESE UNITS

(Makes 4 geese units)

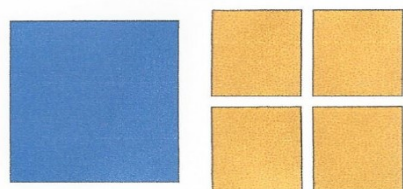
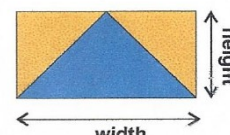


NOTE: These instructions give the formula for making Flying Geese units and do **NOT** give a particular cutting size. Just remember that the width of the finished unit is always twice its height.

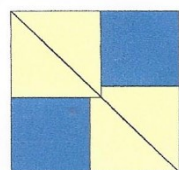
Size to cut squares:

Fabric A: Finished width of desired geese unit + 1 1/4" (1.25)

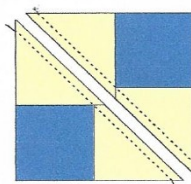
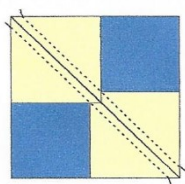
Fabric B: Finished height of desired geese unit + 7/8" (.875)



From Fabric A (the geese fabric), cut ONE (1) _____ square
From Fabric B (the sky fabric), cut FOUR (4) _____ squares

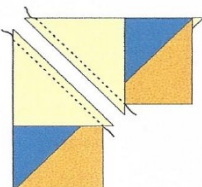
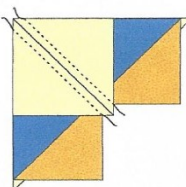
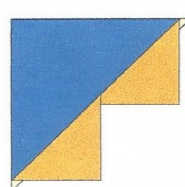


With right sides of fabric together, lay two of the smaller squares on the larger square, as shown. Using a ruler, draw a light pencil line diagonally from top left corner to bottom right corner.



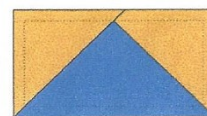
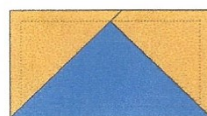
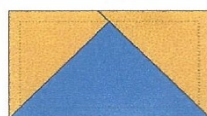
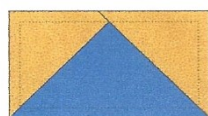
Stitch a scant 1/4 inch on both sides of the drawn line.
Cut apart on the center drawn line.

Note: If your machine does not have an accurate 1/4 inch foot, draw your stitching lines using a ruler and pencil.



Press seams toward Fabric B. Draw a diagonal line on wrong side of smaller square. With right sides together, lay one of the marked squares on the sewn unit and stitch 1/4 inch on both sides of drawn line. Cut apart on drawn line. Repeat with the remaining unit and the remaining smaller square.

Press your 4 geese units open and use them in your favorite quilt blocks!

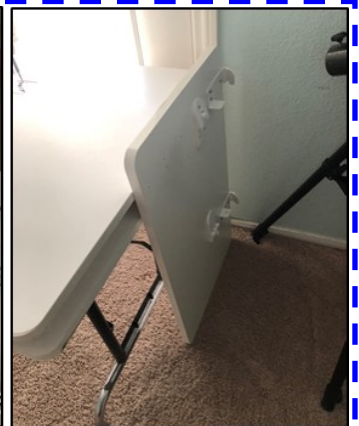

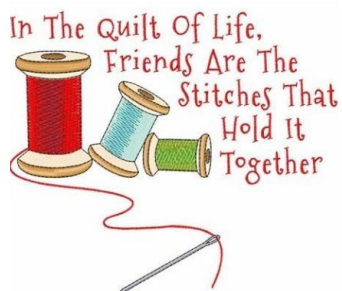

Tips for Better Quilting

1. Start with easy quilts using simple blocks, strip piecing and precuts.
2. Learn to sew a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ inch seam. A scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " is a few threads to the right. Use a $\frac{1}{4}$ inch foot with a guide and measure the needle position to move the needle to get a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " inch seam. If you don't have $\frac{1}{4}$ " foot measure from the needle position and place painter's tape on the foot plate.
3. Use an 80/12 or 90/14 needle for your piecing. Change the needle after each project.
4. Use a sharp blade in your rotary cutter and a good quality ruler that won't slip on the fabric. Use the smallest ruler for trimming blocks. Include the measurement line when you cut.
5. Set your seams before pressing to the dark. Pressing is not the same as ironing. In pressing the iron moves up and down. In ironing the iron is moved back and forth.
6. Use a 50 wt. cotton thread for piecing. Two good ones are Aurifil and Masterpiece by Superior.
7. Using precuts that have a pinked edge, measure from the outside pinked edge, the mountain not the valley.
8. Take care with diagonal seams, handle as little as possible and be careful when pressing.
9. Keep your machine clean, clean out the bobbin area after each project or each time you turn on your machine.
10. When ever you can chain piece your quilt pieces. It will save large amounts of time.

Don't obsess over errors or mistakes. Mistakes are learning experiences or fillings for dog beds. Remember, Quilting is supposed to be fun. Take your time each Project is a chance to improve your skills.

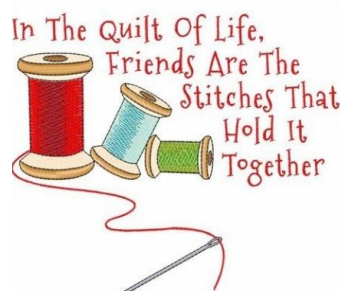

Quick Tips by Phyllis Suiter

How many of you have blocks that you want to put in a quilt on the diagonal but were unsure of how to figure the size of the set-in Triangles that goes on the sides or corners of the blocks? Well, I know I have struggled with this and ended up wasting fabric trying to get the perfect size to match with my blocks. So, here are the calculations to make the perfect set-in side triangles and corner triangles.

For the Corner Set-In Triangles:

Take the finished Block size and *divide* by 1.414, then add .875 (for seams) round up to the nearest 1/8 of an inch. Make a square this size and cut in half on the diagonal once.

For Example: Finished Block size = 6 inches divided by 1.414 = 4.24 + .875 = 5.11 or 5-1/8" square then cut in half on one diagonal.

For Side Set-In Triangles:

Take the finished block size and *multiply* by 1.414, then add 1.25 (for seams) rounded up to the nearest 1/8 inch. Make a square this size cut in half **Twice** on the diagonal to make 4 triangles

For Example: Finished Block size = 8 inches multiplied by 1.414 = 11.31 + 1.25 = 12.56 or 12-5/8 inch square then cut in half twice on the diagonals.

Common Setting Triangle Sizes for the Squares:

Finished Block Size	Corner Triangles	Side Triangles
4"	3-3/4"	7"
5"	4-1/2"	8-3/8"
6"	5-1/8"	9-3/4"
7"	5-7/8"	11-1/4"
8"	6-5/8"	12-5/8"
9"	7-1/4"	14"
12"	9-3/8"	18-1/4"

Remember to cut the corner squares in half on the diagonal and the side squares in fourths on the diagonals.

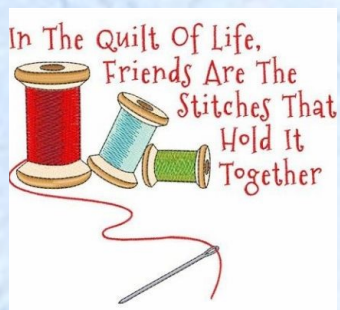

Stabilizers for Embroidery

I've been asked numerous times about which stabilizer should I use for my embroidery project? So, I decided this month I would give a tutorial on Embroidery Stabilizers.

There are basically 5 types of Stabilizers:

Cut-a-way*****Tear- a-way*****Water Soluble

Heat or Melt a-way*****Iron On

How to figure stitch counts: Generally, 1 square inch of filled embroidery = 2,000 stitches.

A low stitch count is up to 7500 stitches, Medium 7501-15,000 stitches, Heavy density stitch is 15,000+ stitches. General rule of thumb, the more stitches and detailed your design the heavier and sturdier the stabilizer needs to be.

Cut-a-way

Cut-a-way stabilizers are usually nonwoven stabilizers with strong even consistency that provides stability during embroidery and after. It also provides good stability for embroidery that is going to be washed. Cut-a-way are also known as mesh, semi-sheer sometimes comes in iron-on. Less bulky and softer than nonwoven cut-a-ways. There are also semi-sheer Polyester cut-a-ways that are used for lightweight fabrics with light to medium stitch count embroideries. You may find different weight cut-a-way stabilizers. Light weight or 1.5 oz/yd is good for low stitch applications. Used with fabrics such as fleece, knits, wool suede, microfiber, medium weight cotton when you have low stitch count embroideries, i.e., open weave or satin stitch appliques. A 2.5 oz weight is good for medium stitch count embroideries with both fill and applique stitches. 3-3.5 oz/yd is heavy weight cut-a-way is the strongest and is used on stretch fabrics, like knits, denim, linen and open weave fabrics also on canvas, fleece, corduroy and velvet, handmade paper and with large complex pattern fill designs.

Tear-a-way

Tear-a-way stabilizers are temporary stabilizers that can be easily removed once the embroidery has been stitch out. Some are fiber tear-a-ways that dissolve when washed. They can be used with most fabrics except stretchy or sheer fabrics. They also come in light, medium and heavy weight and some are "sticky-backed" or fusible. Best used on projects with embroideries that have a clean edge or used with embroidering on towels.

Water-Soluble (WWS)

A water-soluble stabilizer dissolves in water that is 33° to 200° F. It comes in different thicknesses. The lighter weight WSS can be used as a topper for towel embroidery and medium or heavier weight WSS are for Free standing lace designs. WSS is also great for free

standing organza designs such as flowers. It is also use on very delicate fabrics with delicate designs. One use for free motion quilting is to draw you pattern onto the stabilizer with a fine point marker then lay the tracing on top of your quilt and stitch. Tear off any excess and the rest easily washes away. Water Soluble stabilizers should be kept in a plastic bag which prevents them from becoming stiff.

Heat or Melt-a-way

These are stabilizers that are removes from the fabric by using heat. They are mainly used for fabrics that can not be washed such as velvet, sati and sometimes corduroy. They come in woven and plastic like films. The woven ones crumble when heat is applied. Plastic like film heat-a-ways can be used as toppers. The stabilizer beneath the stitches remains permanently intact. A dry heat iron, not steam should be used with these stabilizers.

Iron-On Permanent Stabilizers

In the past several years many embroidery experts have recommended using SF101 Shape-Flex in lieu of any other stabilizer in the hoop. Shape-Flex is a cotton woven fusible stabilizer that adds body and permanent stability when ironed onto the back of the fabric you are going to embroider. It is stable in both the length wise and crosswise grain directions. The fusible glue does not leave any residue on your needle. I have found that it works best for embroidery designs such as detailed but not dense quilt block designs. If your have trouble with it wrinkling after you embroider and iron your design, it is recommended you preshrink the SF 101 in warm water for 10 minutes and then allow to air dry. I have also used spray starch or Terial Magic on my fabric after applying the SF 101 and that helps to eliminate any puckering.

There are many brands of stabilizers on the market. Your embroidery machine dealers carry all types of stabilizers as well as JoAnn's and many embroidery supply websites. To find the best depends on your personal preference and cost.
