while we sew up LVQ's Charity Orphan Block Stash into finished 24" to 36" square NICU quilt tops.

Krystal will be teaching a border technique called Migrating Geese. Charity will kits with an Orphan block, coordinating fabric, backing and batting.

We just need YOU, your sewing machine, \$10 for the room fee and a potluck dish to share.

***Why do we ask for \$10 when we do a Sew Day at Spring Valley Baptist Church?***

When we meet at the Church, we are using their utilities and restroom supplies, tables and chairs. We also are usually teaching some kind of technique during these days (Fernweh quilts, tube quilts, star quilts etc). Your \$10 goes to the \$100 room rental fee we give the Church every time we use their space. Why don't we ask for \$10 when we are at a quilt store? When we are at Sewabilities, Christmas Goose or Downtown Sewing Machine Company attendees have the opportunity to make purchases at these shops that underwrite the event. There is no retail shop at the Church.

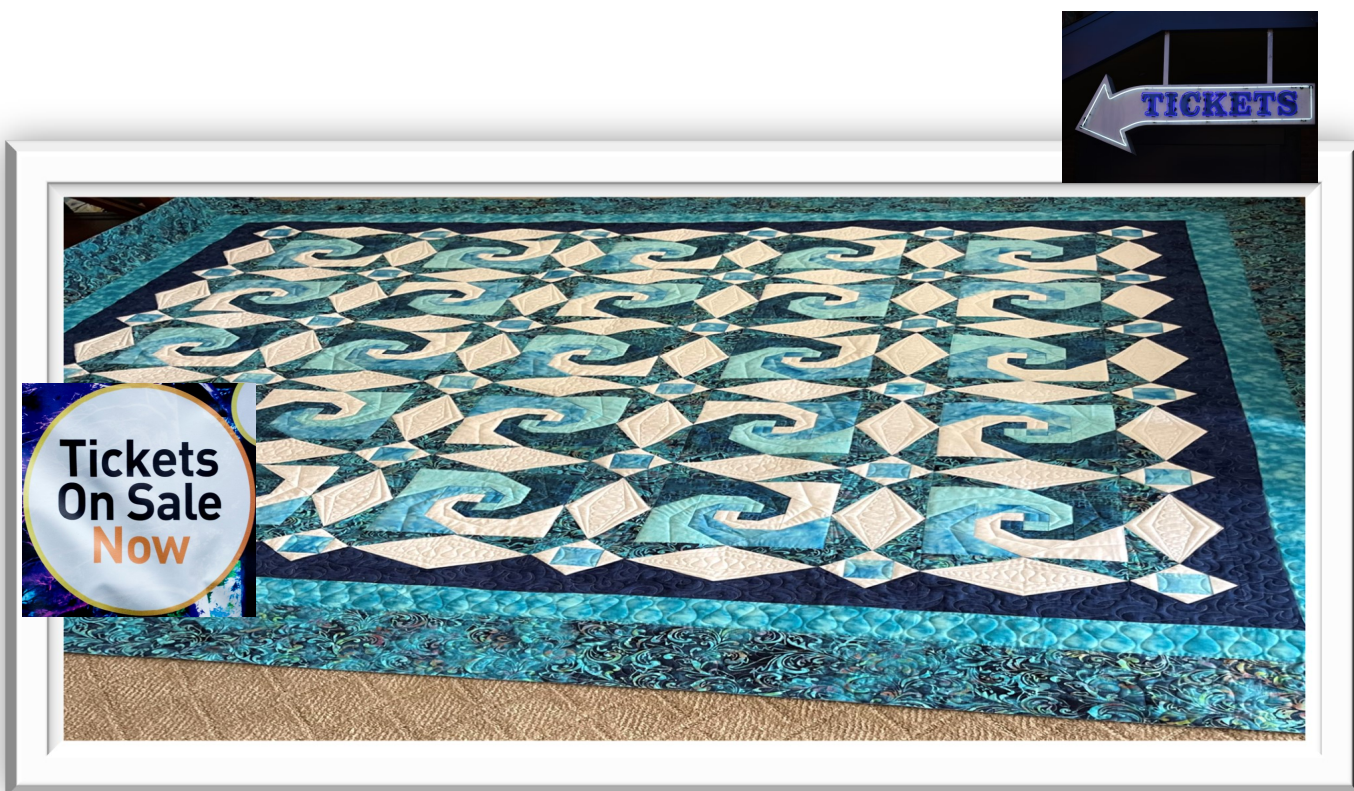


## 2023 Opportunity Quilt

# RATED THE "BEST" PECAN PIE

From "Taste of Home" .....



## Ingredients

- Dough for single-crust pie
  - 1/2 cup butter
  - 2-1/2 cups coarsely chopped pecans
  - 3/4 cup packed brown sugar
  - 3/4 cup maple syrup
  - 1/2 teaspoon salt
  - 3 large eggs, beaten
  - 2 tablespoons whiskey or bourbon, optional
  - 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- Optional: Whipped cream and ground cinnamon

## Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350°. On a lightly floured surface, roll dough to a 1/8-in.-thick circle; transfer to a 9-in. pie plate. Trim crust to 1/2 in. beyond rim of plate; flute edge. Refrigerate while preparing filling.
2. In a Dutch oven or large saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Add pecans; cook, stirring constantly, until very fragrant and pecans start to brown, 4-5 minutes. Remove pecans with a slotted spoon, reserving butter in pan. Stir in brown sugar, maple syrup and salt; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer for 2 minutes. Remove from the heat. In a bowl, whisk a small amount of the hot mixture into eggs; return all to the pan, whisking constantly. Stir whiskey, if desired, and vanilla into brown sugar mixture; stir in pecans. Pour into crust.


Bake until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean, 55-60 minutes. Cover edge with foil during the last 30 minutes to prevent overbrowning if necessary. Cool on a wire rack. If desired, top with whipped cream and cinnamon. Refrigerate leftovers.
