
Orphan Block Trade: Bring your own orphan blocks (grouped by theme if you have more than one of a particular block) to trade with other members or Charity for something you like better.

Krystal will be teaching a border technique called Migrating Geese. Charity will kits with an Orphan block, coordinating fabric, backing and batting.

We just need YOU, your sewing machine, \$10 for the room fee and a potluck dish to share.

Why do we ask for \$10 when we do a Sew Day at Spring Valley Baptist Church?

RATED THE "BEST" PECAN PIE

From "Taste of Home"......

Ingredients

- Dough for single-crust pie
- 1/2 cup butter
- 2-1/2 cups coarsely chopped pecans
- 3/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 3/4 cup maple syrup
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3 large eggs, beaten
- 2 tablespoons whiskey or bourbon, optional
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Optional: Whipped cream and ground cinnamoN



Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. On a lightly floured surface, roll dough to a 1/8-in.-thick circle; transfer to a 9-in. pie plate. Trim crust to 1/2 in. beyond rim of plate; flute edge. Refrigerate while preparing filling.
- 2. In a Dutch oven or large saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Add pecans; cook, stirring constantly, until very fragrant and pecans start to brown, 4-5 minutes. Remove pecans with a slotted spoon, reserving butter in pan. Stir in brown sugar, maple syrup and salt; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; simmer for 2 minutes. Remove from the heat. In a bowl, whisk a small amount of the hot mixture into eggs; return all to the pan, whisking constantly. Stir whiskey, if desired, and vanilla into brown sugar mixture; stir in pecans. Pour into crust.

Bake until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean, 55-60 minutes. Cover edge with foil during the last 30 minutes to prevent overbrowning if necessary. Cool on a wire rack. If desired, top with whipped cream and cinnamon. Refrigerate leftovers.
