

A Quilt of Valor is...

From the beginning, Catherine Roberts had definite ideas about standards of excellence for Quilts of Valor:

I knew a Quilt of Valor had to be a quality-made quilt, not a "charity quilt." A Quilt of Valor had to be quilted, not tied, which meant hand or machine quilting. It would be "awarded," not just passed out like magazines or videos, and would say unequivocally, "Thank you for your service, sacrifice and valor in serving our nation."

Choose Your Fabric and Patterns

- Fabric used for a Quilt of Valor should be quality, 100% cotton fabric appropriate for adults.
- A Quilt of Valor does not have to be red, white and blue, but patriotic colors are very popular with recipients.
- Patterns and blocks can be of any design suitable for a patriotic theme. <u>Browse patterns.</u>
- Avoid juvenile, gender or branch specific fabrics, unless the recipient is known to you.

Put It All Together

- The recommended size of a Quilt of Valor is 60" x 80"; it must be a minimum of 55" x 65" and maximum of 72" x 90.
- The Quilt consists of a top, batting, and backing. It must be machine or hand quilted. A tied quilt is not acceptable for a Quilt of Valor.
- Backings provided to must be 8" wider in width and 8" longer in length.
- Use quality, low loft batting such as cotton, cotton blends, polyester or polyester blends. Quilting should be appropriate for the quilt and not overly dense, which can reduce the loft of the quilt.
- Double fold, also known as French Fold, binding is recommended for durability. Hand stitch or neatly machine stitch binding.
- A Quilt of Valor must be labeled as such (LVQ guild liason will provide quilt labels).
- Donate Your QOV

There are many Veterans and Service Members all over the country who have been nominated and are awaiting their Quilt award. Our local Las Vegas QOV coordinator is Louise Davenport.





- 1 cup unsalted butter- room temperature
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- 1/2 tablespoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup maraschino cherries-chopped (spread cherries on paper towel to drain well or you can use candied maraschino cherries)
- 2/3 cup chocolate chips

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Mix flour and salt, set aside.
- 2. Cream 1 cup unsalted softened butter with 1/2 cup powdered sugar, mix in vanilla.
- 3. Add flour and salt mixture and mix until it starts forming larger clumps.
- 4. Mix in chocolate chips and maraschino cherries.
- 5. Form the dough into the log and press it well or it will crumble when you slice the cookies (the log should be about 2 inch thick) Wrap it in the plastic wrap and chill in the fridge for at least 1-2 hour.
- 6. Preheat the oven to 325 F and line baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 7. Cut the log into 1/4 or 1/3 inch thick slices (if the slices crumbles, press it back together with your hands) and place them onto baking sheet with one inch of space between.
- 8. Bake the cookies 10- 15 minutes (until they just start to turn lightly golden brown on top)
- 9. Let them cool for 5 minutes on a baking sheet before transfer them to a rack to cool completely.
