Modern Machine Quilting: Walking Foot & Free Motion with Christa Watson

Description:

Take your quilts to the next level by adding depth and dimension to your designs. The secret is learning to let go of perfection by creating asymmetrical textures that require little to no marking of the quilt. Unleash the potential of your domestic machine by utilizing both free-motion quilting and walking foot (or dual feed) techniques. Practice on pre-basted fabric and batting samples or use up leftover quilt blocks.

Supply List

- Required: copy of Christa's book: 99 Machine Quilting Designs, available for purchase ahead of time at shop.ChristaQuilts.com.
- Recommended: Christa's book "How Do I Quilt It?"
- 12 practice quilt sandwiches consisting of two large squares of solid or tonal colored
 fabric basted together with batting in between; I recommend at least 10" for the top
 square, 11" for the batting, and 11" or more for the bottom square of each sandwich.
 Baste using basting spray or pins and do NOT stitch around the edges.
- Thread to match your fabrics. I recommend high quality 100% cotton, 50 weight.
- Extra bobbins, thread snips.
- Washable marking pen and straight edge, or painters tape to use as a guide.
- New machine needle: I recommend size 80/12 sharp or topstitch.
- Sketchbook and pen or pencil for note taking and design sketching.
- Sewing machine in good working order with owner's manual and all attachments.
 - It should have zig-zag capabilities and at least a couple of decorative stitches.
 - Make sure the zig-zag stitch plate is attached. This is the regular one that comes with the machine and has a wider hole.
 - Don't forget to bring the entire base of your machine. In other words, don't leave the free arm exposed so you have enough work area.
- Open toe walking foot to fit your machine, or BERNINA dual feed with 20D foot
 - Arrive with it already attached.
- Free motion foot to fit your machine please make sure it fits before class.
 - I prefer the Bernina open toe 24 or the BSR.
- Most important bring your "can-do" attitude this is going to be fun!!!

Learn the secrets for domestic machine-quilting success which include: adequate basting, choosing the right thread colors, thinking about how to divide and conquer each task, and learning how to create rich texture with little to no marking of the quilt.

Christa will also discuss the importance of making a quilting plan, so you can figure out the best path around the quilt with the fewest stops and starts. Once you see how easy and carefree her methods can be, you'll feel empowered to quilt your own quilts!

to yourself to FINISH Projects? There are many names for those unfinished quilt projects we all have stashed in our closets, under the bed or in drawers or bags... WIPs (works in progress), UFOs (unfinished objects), NFUFO (nearly finished UFOs), BBUFO (barely bagun UFOs), PIPS (projects in process), WISPs (works in slow progress), WIVPs (works in very slow progress), PIGs (projects in procery sacks).

We started them because we liked them but for one reason or another we put them aside to finish at another time. Wouldn't it be nice to see those quilt projects completed instead of hiding them away for a few more years? What if the Guild held you accountable to finish those projects?

LINE UP YOUR CARDS

On the attached 2 sheets, list up to 6 UFOs you are committed to finishing this year. Fill out your name and email address. Fill out both sheets and **turn ONE COPY in**

to KRYSTAL HOSMER with your Buy In Bets at any LVQ event. Tack the other one up in your sewing room RIGHT BY YOUR MACHINE so you see it every time you sew.

PLACE YOUR BETS

For each project your list, a BUY IN BET of \$5 is on the line. You may enter up to 6 projects for the year - \$30 total Buy In Bet

PLAY THE GAME

Starting at the February meeting, Krystal will pull a number (1-6) and announce it at each meeting. For the next month you are to work on the project on your list that corresponds to that number and try to finish it (the minimum definition of "finished" is a completed top) for show & tell for the next month. Check a box for every project you finish! Think how proud you'll be when you tell us all "I finally finished this quilt!" The applause alone will make it worth the work!

GO "ALL IN" AND TAKE THE POT

For each month you complete a UFO Challenge and bring it to Show n Tell, you'll get a drawing ticket to the 50/50 Drawing we'll hold at the 2024 LVQ Holiday Party. The Winning ticket gets 50% of the Buy in Bets and the Penalties! The Guild keeps 50% to expand the budget for 2025. The more quilts you finish the more times you'll be entered into the drawing.

***** NO RITIFFING! *****

If you do NOT complete the UFO challenge for the month, you must pay in an additional \$5 penalty at the next meeting. Keep your word to yourself to avoid the penalty.

DOUBLE DOWN

Once you finish a project, if you don't want the quilt, you can donate it to one of our guild charities. Each completed UFO quilt that is donated to the Guild will receive one additional drawing ticket. You must donate the quilt at the meeting your bring it in for Show n Tell.



I'm Betting on Me!







Recipe of the Day: What to Cook in April

Super Nachos

2 bags corn tortilla chips in 2 colors or different flavors, such as blue corn, red corn, yellow corn, lime flavored, chili flavored or black bean chips -- pick 2 favorites Pico de Gallo Salsa:

- 4 vine ripe tomatoes, seeded and chopped
- 1 jalapeno pepper, seeded and finely chopped, for medium to hot heat level
- 1 small white onion, chopped
- 1/4 cup, 2 handfuls, cilantro leaves, finely chopped -- substitute parsley if cilantro is not to your liking

Salt

Beef and Beans Topping:

- 1 tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 pound ground sirloin
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 jalapeno pepper, seeded and chopped
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons dark chili powder
- 1 1/2 ground cumin, half a palmful
- 2 teaspoons to 1 tablespoon cayenne pepper sauce, giving you medium to hot heat level
- 1 can black beans, 15 ounces, drained

Cheese Sauce:

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 cups milk
- 3/4 pound pepper jack cheese, shredded, about 2 1/2 cups
- 1. Arrange a mixture of 2 varieties of corn chips on a very large platter or use your broiler pan as a platter.
- 2. Combine salsa ingredients in a bowl and set aside for flavors to marry.
- 3. Heat a medium nonstick skillet over medium high heat. Add oil, garlic, onion and peppers to the
- 4. pan and saute 2 minutes, then add meat and crumble with wooden spoon. Season meat with salt, chili powder, cumin and cayenne pepper sauce. Cook meat 5 minutes, then stir in beans and reduce heat to low.
- 5. In a medium sauce pot, melt butter and add flour to it. Cook flour and butter 1 to 2 minutes over moderate heat, then whisk in milk. When milk comes to a bubble, stir in cheese with a wooden spoon. Remove cheese sauce from the heat.
- 6. Pour cheese sauce evenly over the massive spread of chips and top evenly with beef and beans
- 7. and the pico de gallo. UBER NACHOS! Serve immediately as is or, garnish with your choice of
- 8. extra toppings from the toppings list.
